Gentlemen Select Men We the undersigned herein petition the Select Men of Waitsfield to provide a [pap?] or Bridle road from the main road leading to the house that Peter Moriarty now lives in though the farm of Roderick Richardson so called to a pastures owned by Cyrus Joslyn also a road from said road or [pap] to a pasture owned by H.O. Skinner. Suitable to drive cattle to and from with proper cure + to drive a yoke of [neea] with cart of sled for the prupose of or having fences & other purposes necessary. Waitsfield May 20. 1859. The conditions of the foregoing petition is such that said Town is not responsible for the making of said Road or for any damages that may occur [whalt] en to us in consequence of not having a worked rod but simply for a fur passage in our necessary burial.

The above described survey was ordered and approved and the roads laid and established agreeable to the survey two rods wide. Said Roads are laid as Pent Roads. And Harris Pike is to place a good and convenient set of Bars or a good and convenient gate at the westerly end of the road where it commences in the ^qualbi highway. Also another good and convenient set of Bars of Gate at the woods or the northerly side of the pasture where the Road enters the woods and maintain said Bars or Gates in good repair at his expense
